**ORDER STAYING DISCOVERY AND TRIAL ON CHAPTER 9 ELIGIBILITY**

The above-captioned case was filed by Connector 2000 Association, Inc. (“Debtor”) with the Court on June 24, 2010. The South Carolina Department of Transportation (“SCDOT”) filed an Objection to the Chapter 9 Petition and Statement of Qualification of the Debtor and Motion to Dismiss the Petition (the “Eligibility Objection”). Responses to the Eligibility Objection have been filed and discovery commenced pursuant to the Court’s Scheduling Order entered on August 11, 2010, and the Amended Scheduling Order entered on October 29, 2010 (collectively “Scheduling Order”). A trial on the Eligibility Objection is scheduled for December 6, 2010 (“Eligibility Trial”).

The Debtor and SCDOT have been in settlement negotiations concerning a consensual plan of reorganization, which if reached, would resolve the Eligibility Objection. Based on these negotiations, the Court believes it is appropriate to stay the Scheduling Order and the Eligibility Trial to allow the parties to concentrate on settlement.

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:**

1. All current deadlines under the Scheduling Order are hereby suspended and stayed, so that the parties can work toward a consensual plan of reorganization.
2. The Eligibility Trial is hereby stayed.

3. Should the Debtor and SCDOT be unable to reach a resolution, either party may request in writing to the Court that the stay be lifted, discovery and other deadlines under the Scheduling Order be reinstated and amended as needed, and the Eligibility Trial rescheduled.

4. Should it appear to the Court that no timely resolution has been reached, the Court, in its discretion, may lift the stay imposed by this Order, reinstate discovery and amend the deadlines under the Scheduling Order as needed, and reschedule the Eligibility Trial.
